



Sense 5-day Intervenor Course - Huntingdon

Dates: Monday 28th November to Friday 2nd December 2016

Venue: Spring Common Academy, American Lane,

Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire PE29 1TQ

Time: 9 to 4 Monday; 9.30 to 4 thereafter

The course is designed specifically for Intervenors or those assigned to work in a 1:1 situation with a congenitally Deafblind/Multi Sensory Impaired child or adult. The week will include teaching, discussion, DVD, tutorials and practical workshops

The course aims to provide participants with the theoretical knowledge and practical skills to carry out their role as an Intervenor and focuses on the in-service needs of Intervenors, Teaching Assistants, Learning Support Staff, Health and Social Care workers and those employed to work on a 1:1 basis with learners who are deafblind with multi-sensory impairment to enable them to support and promote their learning.

Course content includes:

- Causes & implications of Deafblindness
- Visual & Hearing Impairment
- Touch Interaction
- Mobility & Orientation

- The role of the Intervenor
- Communication
- Interactive Environments

Course fees: £480 plus an additional £225 if opting for accreditation

Accommodation: Information on local hotels can be provided on request

Accreditation Option: Together with the University of Northampton, Sense can now offer a qualification as part of the Intervenor training. Participants can opt for accreditation worth 20 CATS (Credit and Accumulation Transfer Scheme) points at Level 4. You can use your 20 CATS points towards certificates, diplomas and degrees recognized by Universities across the UK and also towards HLTA (Higher Level Teaching Assistant) status.

Participants receive a certificate of attendance on successful completion of the five day course. Successful participants are also eligible to join the National Organisation of Intervenors and attend annual NOI Network days.

This course meets the requirements of the Intervenor Standards issued by NatSIP and the DfE.
