



### Welcome to the first edition of our local newsletter for Teaching School Alliances in the East of England.

It's worth taking a moment to think how far our teaching schools and alliances have come in just a few years. There are now over eighty teaching schools across the region, local and sub regional meetings and initiatives, good links with the Office of the Regional Schools Commissioner, local authorities and dioceses and, more importantly, a shared sense of collaboration as we develop a coherent school led system.

Of course, there is a lot to do but the initial meeting of our Teaching Schools East steering committee has taken place and to support my work we have recruited three regional leads, Viv Keller-Garnett, Sue Hammond and Jim Sweetman, to work alongside me.

To ensure the success of the teaching schools work we need the support of all teaching schools and multi-academy trusts. We also want them to be outward looking and involved with the development of the system as much as with improving their own performance.

Already well underway is a round of school to school support funding this term. Applications close this week and decisions will be made in December.

We are also working on the careful use of targeted support funding for developing aspiring heads and recently qualified teachers and further steps to develop the TSC East steering committee and the local structures which will support it. Together, we can make this new system work.

#### The NCTL Targeted Support Fund

This finance is available again to support aspiring head teachers and recently qualified teachers. In different areas of the east this funding provides conferences, additional training and mentor support. The headteacher programmes in particular have an excellent record in supporting experienced teachers on their final journey to headship. The new RQT training now spreading across the region also offers a subsidised programme aimed fairly and squarely at supporting retention as well as keeping teachers in the profession and working in the East. #### **Workload Challenge: funding for schools**

The DFE is offering grant funding of up to £30,000 to support schools in developing sustainable solutions to address teacher workload. Groups of schools are invited to engage with academic researchers to develop and test practical and innovative approaches to the recommendations of the recent independent Teacher Workload Review Group reports. The reports cover: marking, planning and resources and data management.
