Making sense of autism for schools

AET Level 1 Training will:

- Create a common understanding of autism and how it can affect young people in schools.
- Help staff to identify the four key areas of difference to be taken into account.
- Enable staff to appreciate the importance of understanding the individual pupil and their strengths and weaknesses.
- Support staff in determining where pupils with autism need help to build positive relationships with staff and their peers.
- Raise awareness that many pupils with autism can be unusually sensitive to everyday sights, sounds, touch, tastes and smells which affects their learning and emotional state.

What will you cover on the course?

The course is delivered face to face over 1.5 hours. It covers the 4 themes below and uses films to share the voice and perspective of people with autism

- ◇ The individual pupil
- ◇ Building relationships
- ◇ Curriculum and learning
- ◇ Enabling environments

About the training

The AET Hubs training programme has been developed by the Autism Centre for Education and Research (ACER) at the University of Birmingham and Oxfordshire Local Authority. All the materials have been developed in consultation with school staff, individuals on the autism spectrum, parents and carers.

AET Level 2 and Level 3 training will be available in 2015 - 2016 academic year.
