



# Welcome to the December edition of our local newsletter for teaching school alliances in the East of England.

This has been a busy month. We have been working hard to process the school to school support bids so that the money for successful bids can reach schools as early as possible next term. We received a wide range of bids from teaching school alliances across the Eastern region and hope that the majority of them will be successful. As you know, it is sometimes not possible to support proposals for schools which are receiving funding from other sources or in a situation where the RSC has other plans for them but we hope that the funding will allow the reach of our teaching school alliances to increase and support them in the good work they are doing in supporting local schools.

Our Teaching Schools East Steering Group (with representatives from each county) was also pleased to see the roll-out of the SLE training programme across the East, the continuing development of the programme for recently qualified teachers and to be able to report on the highly successful key stage 2 support programme.

We are now asking local authorities to help to broaden the distribution of this newsletter and to support teaching school alliances in their key role of delivering the school led system for every school in the East. Going further, it is good to be able to report that the criteria for application as a teaching school and as an NLE have been widened so that what really now counts is a school's appetite to take part and support others. There is a TSA application round which finishes very soon but there will be two further rounds in this academic year emphasising the DFE's determination to ensure that there are sufficient TSAs in every region to fulfil this challenging role. If your school qualifies, think carefully about what you can offer to support the system and if you need help and advice we are happy to provide it.

### Aspire to Headship: January 27, 2017

This annual conference designed to support teachers in primary, secondary and special school leadership teams into headship is recruiting for January 2017. It is open to teachers from Norfolk, Suffolk, Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

The conference has an excellent track record in helping teachers take the final steps in applying for and achieving headships. Delegates will hear from a range of head teachers discussing issues like developing vision, working with governors, and providing school support as well as receiving guidance on making applications and maintaining a work-life balance.

### **New TSA and NLE application Round**

This application round (November 9 - December 11) is particularly important because it introduces new criteria which allow more schools and head teachers to qualify as TSAs and NLEs.

As a TSA, check to see whether other schools in the alliance might now qualify - thereby building up the resources and capacity of the Alliance. Also, let colleagues know. Building a powerful network of teaching school alliances across the whole country is a major priority for the Teaching Schools Council. You can find more details for TSAs <a href="here">here</a>.

In the eastern region there are many very small schools which might not appear to have the capacity to be teaching schools but which do qualify. We want to help these schools either to be linked together to form new alliances or become a teaching school within an existing alliance.

### **Spanish Teachers Coming!**

Spain's Visiting Teachers programme provides opportunities for schools in England to recruit 'high quality' teachers from Spain to not only teach the language but also immerse pupils in cultural aspects.

### The new application process for SLEs

There will now be two application windows for new SLEs each year on May 31 and October 31. Having two dates makes it easier to plan the training courses offered by teaching school alliances.

The region still needs new system leaders so if you are interested watch out for information sessions offered by teaching school alliances, download an application form and check the head teacher supports you. Head teachers can build these new arrangements into professional development programmes and their financial planning.

The assessment day structure involves a presentation, a formal interview and some kind of written or group exercise. It's a really good qualification to have!

## **Big changes coming for LLE recruitment**

With SLE recruitment and training being so important, Local Leaders of Education (LLEs) have taken a back seat in the past few years. This will change in 2017 when new arrangements for the local recruitment of LLEs will be introduced. The form of the new arrangements reflects the pilot scheme which operated in Cambridge in 2015 and 2016.

The TSC and TSAs will now recruit LLEs and we expect to develop a regional training model for the eastern region following the pattern of the SLE model. As system leaders, LLEs provide local outreach and support. More details of the new arrangements will be sent to schools in the New Year.
